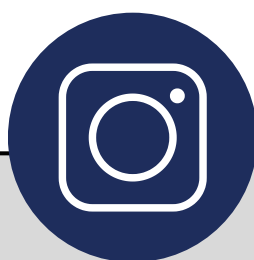

MPFNL NETBALL REPORT

The MPFNL 2023 season officially commenced Saturday 1 April. With strong participation numbers and anticipation of all 22 clubs fielding all four senior sides and 17 & Under, the season ahead was sure to produce local rivalries and grades that would be closer than ever.

A Grade netball became a clear focus through media taking full advantage of live-stream matches weekly. Matches were moved ahead of senior football to showcase the match of the round.

The premier grade also introduced 'Rolling Substitutions' to the competition as an exciting development and progression to netball in the region. The league worked closely with the clubs and umpires in making sure it was suitable and sustainable for the competition. With such success and positive feedback, the 2024 season will have all senior and junior grades adopt 'Rolling Substitutions'.

The MPFNL continued with 'Netball Connect' as the administration system across the netball competition for season 2023. A number of enhancements and updates allowed the system to be a functional and user friendly system for club volunteers. Educational webinars and training sessions were conducted which focused to assist new club administrators with their match day requirements, membership registrations and team lists.

MPFNL NETBALL SUB-COMMITTEE

Following the establishment of the MPFNL Board, further extension to the structure was an MPFNL Netball Sub-Committee. The MPFNL Netball Sub-Committee are nominated netball representatives from member clubs and the MPFNL Board that form a group to represent the MPFNL netball competition.

The standard and competitive balance continues to grow across all grades in Division One and Division Two, the league with the MPFNL Netball Sub-Committee will closely review a Player Point System Policy for netball during the off season and discuss if this is the best implementation to the competition from 2025.

PNUA

The MPFNL continued their partnership with the Peninsula Netball Umpire Association (PNUA) in 2023. The strength of the PNUA committee provided valuable experience and resources of umpiring to the MPFNL clubs. They supported 16 of the 22 clubs with umpires for B and A Grade matches and additional assistance in some of the lower grades when required.

As focus to increase umpire numbers and resources across the region, the league pursued with Club Umpire Coaches, an initiative lead by PNUA. MPFNL clubs received mentoring and training opportunities directly to the club umpires, assisting in growth and education. Additionally, PNUA attended club trainings to provide an opportunity for players to seek rule clarifications and have a better understanding of umpires responsibilities with an added opportunity for connected relationships between players and umpires.

World Netball will introduce new and updated rules to be adopted across all competitions from 2024. Prior to the commencement of the 2024 season, a primary focus within the umpiring department across the league will be the communication, interpretation and education of the new rules for all clubs, players and umpires.

The support from the PNUA has always been refreshing and welcoming and we thank you them for their continued work. We look forward to strengthening the partnership in 2024.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank the dedicated officials, supporters, volunteers and players at each MPFNL member club, for all you efforts conducted throughout the season and your contribution in making the league successful.



FINALS SERIES

The MPFNL netball competition continued the top 5 final series for consistency and to align as a football and netball league. For a number of grades, it came down to the final home and away round to determine the final 5 positions.

In 17 & Under, Mornington were looking to go back to back as they finished the season undefeated. Chelsea, Somerville and Edithvale-Aspendale were well represented across most grades for Division Two, while YCW, Langwarrin and Mt Eliza are acknowledged in Division One.

Naming the matches of the finals series, the D Grade Prelim Final saw Pearcedale hold off Edithvale-Aspendale by 1 goal to advance to the Grand Final. The Division One 17 & Under Grand Final had YCW and Bonbeach go into overtime where the Stonecats were named Premiers after the additional 8 minutes of play. In a thrilling A Grade match between Langwarrin and Sorrento could not be separated until the final minute, as the Roos snatched the win by a single goal.

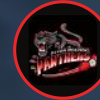

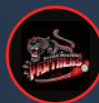

I am pleased to present the Annual Report for the AFL South East Umpiring Department, reflecting on the remarkable year that was 2023. The registered umpire count increased from 409 to 644, contributing to a significant improvement in match appointment rates. For the MPFNL, an impressive milestone was achieved, with 100% of matches having Field Umpires appointed. Similarly, the SEWF witnessed a commendable 98% appointment rate, reflecting the commitment of our umpires to officiate at the highest standards. In our Junior competitions, over 90% of matches had Field Umpires appointed, showcasing the growth and development of our young umpires. This achievement would not have been possible without the dedication of our existing umpires, the recruitment efforts of our team, and the support of the broader AFL South East community. It is a testament to the collaborative spirit that defines our region.

APPOINTMENT OF RUSSELL DAVIDSON (Field Umpires Coach)

In a significant development, we welcomed Russell Davidson as the AFL South East Field Umpires Coach. Russell's appointment comes on the heels of his recognition as the AFL Victoria Coach of the Year in 2022, and we are fortunate to have him on board.
